In addition to her injuries, Conga was emaciated. She had evidence of muscle wasting and kennel sores. Despite her injury and ailments, she had plenty of spirit and love to give; she just needed support and resources to get healthy. Thanks to you, Conga was able to begin treatment immediately.

Our vets performed surgery to repair Conga's fractured leg, but her healing journey was far

from over. For weeks following surgery, we would need to restrict her activity levels and manage her pain. As Conga healed from surgery, she was given a nutrient-rich diet to help her put on weight and regain her strength. A wonderful, dedicated foster volunteer kept a close eye on Conga as she recovered and managed her specialized treatment.

Expansion of Services at our St George Clinic

In 2024, we were thrilled to expand services at our veterinary clinic in St. George. This clinic provides low-cost vaccinations, spay/neuter surgeries, and dental procedures for local pets. In an area where veterinary services are already scarce, this can be a true lifeline for families and pets in need.

Thanks to your support, the St. George Clinic has expanded its hours and added veterinary staff and surgery appointments. With this additional capacity we estimate that 3,000 more pet guardians in southern Utah will have access to our services in 2025.

Pet guardians come from other cities in southern Utah, northern Arizona, and Nevada to get essential care for their animals. And, local rescue groups often utilize the St. George Clinic when emergency care is needed for homeless or vulnerable animals at an affordable cost.



Meet Squash



Running down a remote highway in southern

Utah with his two siblings, six month old Squash was found by an animal services officer. Unfortunately, no one came to claim the sweet pups. Although the siblings didn't have any visible injuries, staff soon noticed that Squash was not putting weight on his left hind leg. The small rural shelter didn't have the resources to investigate his injury further, so they turned to the Humane Society of Utah for help.

Squash was diagnosed with a broken femur head which requires a specialized surgery. We have great orthopedic surgery partners and with your generous support, animals like Squash will always have the resources they need.

After surgery, Squash needed a comfy space and plenty of time to heal. He was placed with a caring foster volunteer for recovery where he is still making great progress. **His foster volunteer reports that he is a sweet and jovial guy who loves to cuddle and rest his head on her lap.**

We are so thankful to everyone who bid, donated, or simply attended our annual gala and made a difference for families and pets in Utah!




Sponsor Highlight: Supreme Source
