## Giving At-Risk Animals a Second Chance



Our Transfer Program is giving more animals the second chances they deserve. In 2024, we worked with shelters across Utah and beyond to transfer 1,338 animals into our care—an incredible 71% increase from 2023. This lifesaving program not only helps reduce shelter overcrowding to save lives but also ensures that animals from overburdened and underresourced areas receive the medical and behavioral support they need to thrive. # Transfer Story: Puppy Mill **Building a More Compassionate Community**

On January 26, 2024, after delays due to bad weather and mechanical issues, the Nebraska Humane Society transfer van arrived at the Humane Society of Utah. Among the nearly 50 dogs rescued from one of The Humane Society of United States "Horrible Hundred" puppy mills, HSU welcomed nine dogs, including four Corgis, two German shorthaired pointers, and three Labs—each in need of care and rehabilitation.

One of those dogs was Batman, a 6-yearold corgi with blue eyes and a cautious but determined spirit. Having spent his life as a breeding male, confined with little human interaction, Batman struggled with trust, leash walking, and adjusting to his new surroundings. With patience, encouragement, and training, HSU staff watched as Batman and his fellow puppy mill survivors gained confidence and curiosity, preparing them for adoption.

When Aryn saw Batman's story on social media, she knew he was meant to be part of her family. After counseling and a careful introduction, Batman found his perfect match. Today, he is active, affectionate, and thriving, proving that with dedicated care and second chances, even the most neglected animals can recover.

Batman's story—and many others—are possible because of the support of our community. Your commitment helps us rehabilitate and rehome animals in need.

# ansion & Impact Breaking Barriers to Veterinary



Expanded veterinary services made a difference for community owned pets by providing essential care without financial barriers. Thanks to our 2024 expansion, more families were able to keep their beloved pets healthy and at home.







With a nationwide veterinarian shortage and rising costs, accessible pet care has never been more critical. Thanks to your support, we expanded our Murray Clinic in 2024, ensuring more pets receive the care they need to stay healthy and in loving homes. This year, we launched a new wellness clinic, introducing preventative care exams—including bloodwork—for the first time and more affordable treatment options. These expanded services allow pet owners to catch health concerns early, improve their pets' well-being, and reduce emergency veterinary costs.

In 2024, the Humane Society of Utah completed renovations at our St. George clinic, expanding veterinary staff, operating hours, and surgical capacity to meet the growing demand for affordable pet care in Southern Utah.

This expansion allows us to provide:

- 4,000 additional pet vaccinations
- 1,000 more spay/neuter surgeries
- 200 additional dental procedures
- Support for 3,000 more pet guardians

**77,264** clinic clients received support in caring for their pets through our affordable veterinary clinics











