

## **Recommended Kitten Vaccination Schedule**

Given: 1st Set (8 weeks old): \$35 (with free deworming) Next Due:

• First FVRCP (Feline Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia, Chlamydophila)

• First Deworm (Pyrantel for Roundworm)

Given: 2nd Set (12 weeks old): \$60 (with \$20 package discount and free deworming) Next Due:

Second FVRCP

• First FeLV (Feline Leukemia)

Second Deworm

Given: 3rd Set (16 weeks old): \$70 (with \$30 package discount) Next Due:

Third FVRCP

- Second FeLV
- 1 Year Rabies
- Microchip Implant recommended for \$40
- Schedule a spay/neuter appointment

Initial kitten vaccinations should be given every 3-4 weeks, starting at 8 weeks old until the kitten reaches at least 16 weeks old. A minimum of three sets of FVRCP should be provided.

The total number of sets needed will depend entirely on the kitten's age at each visit. To minimize cost, guardians may bring their kitten in at precisely 8, 12, and 16 weeks old.

If sets are given any longer than 4 weeks apart, additional vaccinations will be necessary at the guardian's expense. If kittens start their vaccinations earlier than 8 weeks old or complete the above series before reaching 16 weeks old, additional vaccinations will be necessary at the guardian's expense.

## The cost is \$35 for each additional FVRCP needed.

Kittens 16 weeks and older require two sets of FVRCP given 3-4 weeks apart. The vaccinations included in the final set are current for one year. When they return a year later, they will be given an FVRCP and Rabies that will be good for three years.

The Feline Leukemia Virus vaccination should be given to **ALL** cats under one year old. FeLV requires a booster 3-4 weeks after the initial **immunization**, then an annual booster for cats with a high risk of exposure (typically cats who spend time outdoors).
