## Recommended Puppy Vaccination Schedule

- Given:**      **1st Set (8 weeks old): \$40** *(with free deworming)*      **Next Due:**
- First DA2PP (*Distemper, Adenovirus Type 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza*)
  - First Deworm (*Pyrantel for Roundworm*)
- Given:**      **2nd Set (12 weeks old): \$55** *(with a \$15 package discount and free deworming)*      **Next Due:**
- Second DA2PP
  - Annual Intranasal Bordetella (*Kennel Cough*)
  - Second Deworm
- Given:**      **3rd Set (16 weeks old): \$50** *(with a \$10 package discount)*      **Next Due:**
- Third DA2PP
  - 1-Year Rabies
  
  - Start optional "lifestyle vaccinations" (*Influenza, Lyme, Leptospirosis*)
  - Microchip Implant recommended for \$40
  - Schedule a spay/neuter appointment

Initial puppy vaccinations should be given every 3-4 weeks until the puppy reaches *at least 16 weeks old*. A *minimum* of three sets of DA2PP should be provided.

**The total number of sets needed will depend entirely on the puppy's age at each visit. To minimize cost, guardians may bring their puppy in at precisely 8, 12, and 16 weeks old.**

If sets are given any longer than 4 weeks apart, additional vaccinations will be necessary at the guardian's expense. If puppies start their vaccinations earlier than 8 weeks old or complete the above series before reaching 16 weeks old, additional vaccinations will be necessary at the guardian's expense.

**The cost is \$40 for each additional DA2PP needed.**

Puppies 16 weeks and older require two sets of DA2PP given 3-4 weeks apart. The vaccinations included in the final set are current for one year. When they return a year later, they will be given a DA2PP and Rabies good for three years.

The Intranasal Bordetella vaccination is current for one year and should be repeated annually to protect dogs from the highly contagious, airborne virus. Influenza is recommended for dogs who frequent dog parks and boarding facilities. Leptospirosis is recommended for dogs who hike and swim in nature due to the risk of exposure to infected wildlife urine. Lyme is recommended for dogs who hike and are not on tick prevention.
