



MISSION

The Humane Society of Utah is dedicated to the elimination of pain, fear, and suffering in all animals. Our goal is to keep pets and people together, bring them together, and help move each animal to their most appropriate outcome as quickly as possible.



BACKGROUND

Founded in 1960, the Humane Society of Utah is the largest nonprofit, private animal shelter organization in the state. We welcome any companion animal that can be legally admitted and work to find each animal in our care a loving home.

The Humane Society of Utah is also the state's leading provider of affordable, quality veterinary care, operating two public clinics. The primary clinic is located at the Murray headquarters and adoption center campus. The Humane Society's new St. George clinic was opened in 2021. Combined, the two clinics provide services to about 48,000 (10,800 in St. George) pets each year and generate more than \$2 million in net revenue to support the organization's critical mission.

The Humane Society of Utah is poised to expand further to meet the growing needs of the community and is working toward establishing a new St. George Clinic building and Pet Resource Center on newly acquired land.

For 63 years, the Humane Society of Utah has served as a vital resource. Staying at the forefront of best practices and community support, we implement new programs to save lives and support owners like we never have before to produce the best outcomes for all animals, both in our pet resource center and in the communities we serve.

The Humane Society of Utah does not euthanize any healthy or adoptable animal in our care and exceeds nationally accepted no-kill standards. Our approach is always to find the best, most humane outcome for the animals in our care and create an environment of respect, responsibility, and compassion through our programs, advocacy, and education.

While the Humane Society of Utah works to save lives in Utah and beyond, we have always stressed that the







job ahead of us is too big for any organization. This is why we feel fostering a cooperative animal welfare community is important. The Humane Society of Utah works with hundreds of rescue groups and animal shelters to advocate for better animal-friendly laws and policies and to transfer animals into our facilities when other organizations need assistance.

- More than 48,000(10,800 in St. George) owned pets helped through clinic services annually
- More than 5,500 adoptions
- Pet Retention Programs have kept more than 2,200 animals together with their families.
- More than 10,000 children enrolled in Humane Education Programs

The Humane Society of Utah has experienced dramatic growth over the last decade. With the generous support of the community, the organization has seen its annual budget increase from \$3.6 million in 2013 to \$10.5 million in 2024.





THE OPPORTUNITY

The Humane Society of Utah is in its search for a passionate, collaborative veterinarian for full time at our St. George Clinic to conduct surgeries (mostly HQHVSN and dentals) and hopefully grow with the clinic over time.

- Mentorship from an experienced veterinarian and surgeon in HQHVSN, dentals, and other surgeries.
- ✤ A fun, supportive, and wellness-based workplace.
- Meaningful work, knowing that you're making an immense difference in the lives of animals who would often otherwise be unable to access care.
- Eligible for the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) loan repayment program.

The Ideal Candidate:

- Practice veterinary medicine within a high-volume surgical setting, striving to provide the best possible care.
- Maintain up-to-date knowledge of surgical procedures and companion animal health issues.
- Is committed to ensuring an organizational culture of inclusivity, collaboration, respect, and accountability.
- Has strong interpersonal and communication skills, strong personal integrity, and an ability to build effective relationships at all levels.
- Treat all animals humanely, properly, and with compassion at all times, regardless of the situation or circumstance; promote a humane and caring attitude toward all animals at all times.



Required Education and Experience:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from an accredited college or university and one year of professional veterinary medical experience.
- Possession of a current license to practice veterinary medicine in the state of Utah.
- An interest in and willingness to support the mission, vision, and philosophy of the Humane Society of Utah (HSU).
- Ability to operate, maneuver, and/or provide simple but continuous adjustments on equipment such as surgical instruments, syringes, microscopes, diagnostic equipment, computer terminal, and/or materials used in performing essential functions.
- Ability to coordinate eyes, hands, feet, and limbs in performing movements requiring skill and training, such as performing surgery and giving injections.
- Vision abilities required include close vision, distance vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.
- Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing, with the public, fellow employees, and volunteers.
- Meticulous and methodical attention to recordkeeping and reporting.
- Skilled in conflict resolution if needed.
- Efficiency and competency working in a high-quality, high-volume spay/neuter setting.
- Effective time management skills and ability to thrive in a high-volume environment.
- Ability to stand, walk, stoop, kneel, crouch, climb, and manipulate (lift, carry, move) up to 50 pounds.
- Ability to work with animals of varying temperaments in noisy conditions.
- Ability to work with cleaning materials.
- Ability to use strength and agility while working with active animals.
- Responsible for presenting a neat and professional appearance to the public at all times.

Salary & Benefits

LOCATION



Beautiful St. George, Utah. St. George is the largest city in Washington County and the fifth-largest city in Utah, with approximately 100,000 residents. In recent years, people from across the United States have been attracted to St. George's world-class
